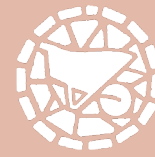

CHOOSE ALL

God desires us to claim the power of the Cross and allow ourselves to be loved by Him.

HONOR THE UNREST

Our unrest is an alert of the Holy Spirit and an invitation to healing.

*“So they called the blind man, saying to him, ‘Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you.’ He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, ‘What do you want me to do for you?’ The blind man replied to Him, ‘Master, I want to see.’ Jesus told him, ‘Go your way; your faith has saved you.’ Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. STEPS TO HONOR THE UNREST

The enemy knows that the more terrible we treat our mind, body, and soul, the worse we feel, and the more we will be limited in our service to God as the Body of Christ. The more time we spend in God’s Light of Truth, the further we travel from Satan’s lying darkness so we can embrace our true beauty and love ourselves. We honor the unrest by discerning what the Lord is inviting us to do? Repent? Forgive? Personal Deliverance? Reception of the Sacraments? Then, we obey. If He is leading us to repentance, forgiveness, or personal deliverance, we use the power of Jesus’ name. We speak in private and aloud (demons cannot read our minds) using the following steps:

SPEAKING ~ FORGIVENESS

Over Myself: *In the name of Jesus, I repent of lying. In the name of Jesus, I forgive myself for lying.*

Over Others: *In the name of Jesus, I forgive (this person) for (this specific injury). Remember ~ This is not a replacement for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. God desires us to have both the healing grace of the Sacraments and the healing power in the name of Jesus.*

SPEAKING ~ PERSONAL DELIVERANCE: RENOUNCE, REMOVE, RECEIVE

Renounce (Spirits): *In the name of Jesus, I renounce the spirit of*

(fear, doubt, hopelessness, perfectionism, control, pride, resentment, self-pity, unworthiness, workaholicism, unforgiveness, lust, vanity, unrepentance, adultery, addiction, masturbation, etc.)

Renounce (Lies): *In the name of Jesus, I renounce the lie that*

(I am a bad mom, I am a burden, I am unlovable, I am a failure, I don’t belong, I am alone, I am the only one struggling, etc.)

Remove: *Jesus, please remove these lies, these spirits, and any related spirits.*

Receive: *Father, please bless me. Please fill me with Your peace, love, joy, truth, and hope.*

WEED MAINTENANCE

We can look at honoring the unrest as weeding a garden. We pull the weeds by renouncing, we ask Jesus to remove them, and then we receive the blessing. We feel lighter and freer when the weeds are no longer blocking God’s light. We are always healing, so whenever we notice we are losing our peace and joy, we just pause and enter into that unrest, and follow the steps above.

TRUE BEAUTY

God desires us to receive His love, love ourselves, and love others.

“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” Mark 12:28-31 (from the Gospel 11/3/24)
